ANNOUNCING: VECTOR CONTROL TRAINING IN NEW MEXICO

WHAT: 2010 Vector Control Course; see attached agenda for details on topics covered.

PRESENTED BY: New Mexico Department of Health, New Mexico Department of Agriculture, and Albuquerque Environmental Health Department.

WHEN and WHERE: May 4-6, 2010; Nativo Lodge, 6000 Pan American Fwy NE, Albuquerque.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND: Environmental Health and Vector Control professionals, current Category 8 license holders, persons needing to obtain a category 8 license, or anyone else interested in mosquito and vector control. Current license holders will receive 4 continuing education units (the required number for recertification) whether attending 1, 2 or 3 days.

COST: Pre-registration fee (postmarked by April 12) is \$45 for government employees/public applicators; \$75 for pest control operators and other commercial or private applicators. Registration fee is payable to the New Mexico Environmental Health Association (“NMEHA”—see attached registration form). At the door registration (after April 12) will only be offered on a space-available basis for \$65 public applicators and \$95 commercial/private applicators.

HOTEL INFO: The Nativo Lodge is located in northeast Albuquerque. From I-25 take exit 230 for Osuna Road & San Mateo Blvd. Turn south onto San Mateo Blvd., then east onto Pan American Freeway (the hotel is just past Starbucks). Parking is available at no charge. The hotel is holding a block of rooms until April 12, 2010. Rates are \$69 single or double, plus tax.
