Southern New Mexico Aid & Comfort Partnership is Here!

The Southern New Mexico Aid & Comfort Partnership (SNMACP) fund was created to provide financial assistance that will reduce the incidence of inability of HIV positive persons to pay for HIV health related services to maintain their health and well being. The SNMACP will provide financial assistance for the following:

- Non-Formulary Prescription Drugs
- Medical Co-pays
- Vision Care

Persons living with HIV/AIDS residing in Southern New Mexico and a current client of the CCC program may apply via an application process administered by the CCC

Staff. The CCC Staff may receive requests for special consideration for financial assistance not covered under the three provisions, but they must be based on medical need and will be reviewed by the SNMACP committee.



Each client will be considered for eligibility based on the Federal Poverty Guidelines. No payments will be made directly to the client. In addition to the application, to receive assistance for Non-Formulary Medications and Vision Care, the client must request a Pro-Forma Invoice from their Pharmacy or Eye

Center *prior* to picking up the medications or visiting the Eye Center. With the Pro-Forma Invoice, a check can be made out directly to the Pharmacy or Eye Center and can be picked up by the client before they pick up their medications from the pharmacy or go to their eye care appointment. For Medical Co-pays, the client must present a bill from the medical agency posted within the last 90 days.
