REQUIRED TRAINING FOR ALL TITLE X STAFF

Definition of All Title X Staff: Every person who works with or has contact with Title X clients. This can include:

- Receptionists and Clerks
- Administrative Staff
- Clinical Staff (Medical Assistants, Medical/Medication Technicians)
- Licensed Staff (Clinicians, Nurses)
- Volunteers and Students

Certificate Maintenance:

Certificates of Completion must be maintained at each Public Health Office (PHO) and Provider Agreement (PA) site where the staff member works. Certificates may be requested for all Title X staff by the Department of Health (DOH) Family Planning Program (FPP) during site visits.
