To Whom It May Concern:

The 'List of Notifiable Diseases or Conditions in New Mexico' was updated on June 15, 2016. The following modifications were made:

- Emergency reporting
 - Bordetella species (including pertussis) this represents only a change in language as Bordetella species have been reportable; however, NMDOH received feedback that some reporters were not aware that pertussis was one of the Bordetella species
 - Middle East respiratory syndrome this represents an addition
 - Viral hemorrhagic fever this represents an addition
- Routine reporting
 - Arboviral disease (note: this would include Zika Virus Disease)
 - Chikungunya virus disease this represents an addition
 - Hansen's disease/leprosy this has been reportable; however, the responsible group at NMDOH has changed
- Healthcare-associated infections reporting
 - All carbapenem-resistant *Enterobacteriaceae* (CRE) and carbapenem-resistant *Pseudomonas aeruginosa* (CR-PA) cases, including non-healthcare-associated, will be reported to the New Mexico Department of Health these represent additions to the list
- Tuberculosis
 - Report suspect or confirmed cases to NMDOH Tuberculosis Program by fax at 505-827-0163 or by phone at 505-827-2471 or 505-827-2473: active disease within 24 hours; infection within 72 hours
 - o This does not represent an addition but rather offers clarifying language
- Environmental exposures
 - Fracture due to fall among older adults this represents an addition
- Genetic and congenital hearing screening

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- Newborn critical congenital heart defects screening (all results) - this represents an addition
