

Your Guide to Medical Cannabis Unit Limits

What is a unit?

- A unit is how your medical cannabis is measured so it is easier to track.
- If you are using dried flower (the buds), 1 unit=1 gram. If you are using edibles, creams, or oils, 1 unit = 200 milligrams (.2 grams) of THC-the active ingredient.
- A unit helps you know how much you are using, no matter what form you use!

How much can you buy?

- Patients enrolled in the Medical Cannabis Program can buy up to **425 units** (or 15 ounces) over a “rolling” 90-day period.
- Every day, what you bought 91 days ago is cleared and the units are added back to your limit. This means your available units update daily, not all at once.

Follow the directions on the patient portal website and you will be able to see your sales history from the last 90 days.

What if you reach your limit?

- If you use all your 425 medical units, more medical units cannot be requested. You will need to wait until past purchases clear from your 90-day limit.
- You can still buy recreational cannabis, if you are 21 or older, but you will need to pay tax and will not have access to the medical products until your units are added back to your account.

PLEASE NOTE:
Reciprocal patients must track their own units - the program does not provide this information.
