

## Reading Your Unit Report

Patients in the program can purchase up to 230 patient units of medical cannabis and/or medical cannabis products over a rolling three-month period (or 90 days). Patients can purchase a variety of products including dried flower, as well as alternative products such as edibles, tinctures, and topicals.

### What is a "Patient Unit?"



For dried flower, *1 patient unit equals 1 gram*. 230 units is approximately 8 ounces of dried flower product.



For any other product such as edibles, tinctures, oils, topicals, etc. *1 patient unit is equal to 200 milligrams* (or 0.2 grams) of THC contained in the product.

EXAMPLE	Total THC	Calculation (product mgs/200)	Patient Units	Calculation (230/patient units)	How Much Can You Buy?	Total Units
Chocolate Bar	200 mg	200/200 =	1 unit	230/1 =	230 bars	230 units
Capsules	40 mg	40/200 =	.2 units	230/.2 =	1150 caps	230 units
Tincture/ Oil	400 mg	400/200 =	2 units	230/2 =	150 oil containers	230 units
Wax	1000 mg	1000/200 =	5 units	230/5 =	46 wax containers	230 units

The total number of patient units you can purchase is 230 in a 90 day period. It can include different items. In the example above, within a 90-day period, you might buy 80 grams/units of dried flower, 38 tinctures (2 units/tincture), 40 chocolate bars (1 unit/bar), and still have 34 patient units left.

All items from an approved dispensary should be labeled with the total amount of THC and number of patient units. If something you want to buy is not labeled, **ask a store employee**.

### What is a "Rolling Three-Month Period"?

Your patient units are tracked every time you purchase products from a dispensary. Patient units that you purchase today will fall off your total patient unit count after 90 days (based on the rolling three-month period).

At at any point, you can ask an employee at the dispensary how many patient units you have left before you purchase anything. You can also check your units on-line at <https://mcp-patient-tracking.nmhealth.org/>.

If you think there is an error on your unit report, please send a letter or an email to our office\*. Include the date and time of the purchase listed and what you think is wrong. We will check the purchase and notify you of what we find.

If you run out of units often, please talk to your medical provider. If they feel it is needed, they may write a letter recommending an increase. The letter needs to have the name that is on your card and your date of birth. It also needs to say the medical need for more units.

\* Units may be uploaded from dispensaries to the State system after business hours.
