Cannabis Regulation Act

- Took effect on Tuesday, June 29, 2021
- Department of Health continues to maintain the Patient Registry and Patient Services under the Lynn and Erin Compassionate Use Act
- Regulation and Licensing Department Cannabis Control Division will be responsible for all licensing and production of cannabis
- A total of 13 staff positions have transferred to the newly created Cannabis Control Division as of June 29, 2021






Personal Production Licenses

- □ The Cannabis Regulation Act eliminated Personal Production Licenses from the Lynn and Erin Compassionate Use Act.
- Starting on June 29, 2021, it was legal through the Cannabis Regulation Act for any individual 21 or older in New Mexico to grow cannabis.
- Individuals can legally grow up to 6 mature and 6 immature plants with a total of 12 mature and 12 immature plants per household.
- Immature cannabis plant is defined as having no observable flowers or buds.

120,957 enrolled patients as of July 31, 2021






There are Medical Cannabis Patients in Every County in NM
