This DDW Therapy Update is current as of the time of release. Therapists and readers are expected to follow the latest DDSD guidance available.

Greetings from Betsy at CSB

This is a summer of challenges and opportunities in our system. Growth of the DD Waiver continues. About 45% of new allocations select Mi Via services and the remainder opt for traditional DD Waiver. Although many are under age 21 with therapy covered by EPSDT and schools, the adult allocations may need services.

CSB is actively recruiting PTs, OTs, and SLPs to provide DD Waiver services. In addition, we have funding in FY 23 for contracts for additional Safety Net services. These contracts are separate from DDW Therapy contracts and are focused to provide support for rural and underserved areas. Please contact Felicia Vidro, or the Therapy Consultants for more information.

Just a reminder that decisions about the delivery of therapy services is always up to the person or their guardian. Therapy services may be provided in person, remotely or a combination of both.

Finally, these are stressful times for us all. COVID-19 cases are rising. Staffing issues continue to impact residential providers. We have included some tips in the box below. I am asking you to please be patient, professional and kind to yourselves and each other. Continue to be creative in collaborating with residential providers to meet the individual's needs. Reach out to CSB and the Regional Office Staff when you need help with resolving issues. In addition, I ask that you take care of yourselves. Take some time off to refresh your mind, heart, and body. Working with the person/DSP/FLP is *still* at the core of what we do

A few hints for supporting effective *team dynamics*:

- Talk to others on the team. Ask what has worked for them for scheduling, training, etc.
- Consider co-training with another therapist or BSC to make it easier for DSP/FLP.
- Reach out to the CM for information or support.
- Call the Residential/Day Program SC (or both!) to communicate about WDSIs, TSS, Action Steps, etc.

About *short staffing* needs:


- Due to the continuing Public Health Emergency, certain exceptions to staffing are allowed under Appendix K
- Check with the Living Provider, what is their status?
 Providers are required to have a plan for when they are short staffed.
- Review your WDSIs, look for possible changes to simplify care for staff and ensure the person's safety
- Consider scheduling group trainings

Subtle Signs of Illness and Injury Course

formerly 'Indications of Illness and Injury'

- due within 90 days of hire for all therapy providers
- online course, available anytime
- anyone can take the updated version (4.25 free CEs available for OT/PT)
- need to sign in thru CDD training hub (check with agency admin if unsure)

OT/PT Supervisors: Be sure you know your Practice Act guidelines for supervison of assistants

Please, please review the draft ISPs and budget worksheets sent by CMs. As part of the IDT, each team member is responsible to review the ISP, TSS, and other documents for accuracy before the budget year starts.

Reminder: if the ARST shows moderate or high risk, it's important that the team starts the CARMP development process right away!

INFORMATION AND RESOURCES FOR THERAPY AGENCY OWNERS AND **ADMINISTRATORS**

Each Therapy Agency is responsible for:

- Monitoring SIM status
- Ensuring all providers have access to Therap, know how to use SCOMM, and know how to do ongoing caseload updates - 'how-to' handout https://www.nmhealth.org/publication/view/form/7459/
- Sharing all DDSD communication with all providers

Therapy Agencies are also required to maintain documentation for all providers:



- Current state licensure
- Completion of all required DDSD trainings
- Current vaccination requirements (or exemption documentation including weekly testing, as applicable)

Self-Imposed Moratorium

- SIM expires after 6 months unless you renew
- Provider Agencies cannot deny services to any individual once a SFOC form has been signed, unless DDSD has granted an exception to the Provider Agency.

NMDOH

The New Mexico DD Waiver needs more PT/PTAs, OT/COTAs, and SLPs

- Work with adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) in their homes and in the community. In-person/telehealth (hybrid) service provision is allowable.
- Therapists may join an existing DDW Provider Agency or start their own small business. contracting directly with the NM Developmental Disabilities Supports Division.
- Flexible hours. Full or part-time work is available. Enjoy autonomy and competitive pay.

Medicaid DD Waiver Reimbursement Rates:


- PT, OT, SLP \$34.93/per 15 min unit = \$139.72/hour
- PTA, COTA \$23.78/per 15 min unit = \$ 95.12/hour > Incentive rates available in many counties


