

New Hire Packets for EOR's and Employees Require an Email

One unique individual email is required for all employer of record (EOR) and employee new hire packets to process as of 11/1/2022. Please make sure that the email as well as all contact information is entered, so not to cause a delay in processing EOR and new hire packets. Your email address will be used for: Communications and notifications from Palco or Conduent for timesheets and program communication. These email notifications will help you ensure timesheets are correct and payment will be on time.

Internet Bill Submissions

Internet is a covered good under the Mi Via program. When asking for Internet on your budget, it is very important to attach the internet bill or invoice. The internet bill must be very clear and show what cost is being asked for. The Mi Via program cannot pay for internet services for family members, EOR's or employees.

Items such as equipment charges, Google Play, Disney Plus, and other streaming services are not covered under the Mi Via program. Add on items may show on your internet bill, but Mi Via cannot pay for them. Add on items cannot be included in the total that is being asked for the internet service on your budget.

SERVICE HIGHLIGHT-

Community Direct Support and Navigation

Community Direct Support include:

- Find, grow, support, and keep community connections.
- Access social, educational, recreational and leisure options.
- Aid the participant outside of their residence.
- Supports the participant in having the ability to grow useful roles in the community
- Build and strengthen usual supports, networks, friendships and build a feeling of belonging within their community.
- This service builds self-determination, increases connection, and builds the participants ability to connect with and give to his or her community
- Participant is supported to make these community connections personally, NOT <u>as part of a group of people with</u> <u>disabilities.</u>

This service does not cover formal education, including home schooling, tutoring or vocational services. Community Direct Support does not duplicate waiver case management services as it is a service provided outside of the participants home.
