STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR ADOPTION OF PROPOSED REPEAL/REPLACEMENT OF REQUIREMENTS FOR LONG TERM CARE FACILITIES RULE

Kathyleen M. Kunkel, Secretary for the New Mexico Department of Health, following a public hearing conducted on May 6, 2020, on the proposed repeal and replacement of the Requirements for Long Term Care Facilities rule, part 7.9.2 NMAC, hereby adopts the proposed repeal and replacement rule. This decision is based on the entire record in this matter, which includes a recording of the hearing and the Report and Recommendation of the Hearing Officer, Craig T. Erickson, Esq., dated May 11, 2020.

In further support of this action the Secretary finds the following:

- 1. The Department of Health is authorized to repeal promulgated regulations and to promulgate regulations as may be necessary to carry out the duties of the Department and its divisions. NMSA 1978, Section 9-7-6(E), and to enact this rule pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 24-1-2, Section 24-1-3 and Section 24-1-5.
- 2. In accordance with NMSA 1978, Section 14-4-5.2, notice of the public hearing for the proposed rule adoption was published in the New Mexico Register, the official publication for notices of all rulemaking in New Mexico, on March 24, 2020.
- 3. In accordance with NMSA 1978, Section 9-7-6(E), notice of the public hearing for the proposed rule changes was also published in the Albuquerque Journal newspaper on March 24, 2020.



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- 4. In accordance with NMSA 1978, Section 14-4-5.2, prior to the date of the rule hearing, notice of the public hearing for the proposed rule changes was also posted to the agency website at http://www.nmhealth.org, as well as to the NM Sunshine Portal at http://www.newmexico.gov.,
- 5. By a letter dated March 5, 2020, the Secretary designated Mr. Erickson to serve as hearing officer for the purpose of conducting the hearing and submitting a recommendation regarding the proposed repeal and replacement rule.
- 6. A public rule hearing was held in Albuquerque, New Mexico via Cisco WebEx on May 6, 2020 pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 9-7-6(E).
- 7. Members of the public were afforded an opportunity to comment orally on the proposed rules at the hearing, and in writing prior to the hearing through the close of business on May 6, 2020.
- 8. The purpose of the proposed repeal and rule amendment is to replace the rule with one in the current format required for rules, and to adopt a revision to 7.9.2.27 NMAC, to lower the age to hire direct care staff to 16 years of age, as more fully described in the rulemaking record.
- 9. No written comments from members of the public were received prior to the rule hearing, no oral or written comments were made at the rule hearing, nor were any written comments received after the rule hearing up until the close of business on May 6, 2020. These facts are described in the May 11, 2020 recommendation letter from the Hearing Officer to the Secretary.
- 10. The Secretary finds that the Hearing Officer has appropriately considered the entire record and finds that the recommendations of the Hearing Officer are appropriate

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11. The Secretary further finds that there were no written and oral public comments received.

12. An emergency rule amendment to 7.9.2 NMAC was previously adopted by the Cabinet Secretary on March 26, 2020 and published in the NM Register, Vol. XXXI, Issue 7, on April 7, 2020. By amending 7.9.2 NMAC within 180 days of the emergency rule amendment, in accordance with NMSA 1978, § 14-4-5, the Cabinet Secretary adopts a permanent rule that replaces the March 26, 2020 emergency rule amendment.

13. The Secretary finds that the proposed repeal and replacement of 7.9.2 NMAC, as recommended by the Hearing Officer, is appropriate and consistent with the authorizing law, and the proposed rule, a copy of which is attached hereto. is hereby adopted.
